

RIDE SAFE ON THE GOLDEN GATE!

There are more cyclists using the Golden Gate Bridge than ever before. That's good news for congestion relief, air quality, and physical fitness, but it also means that cyclists must be extra cautious and patient when riding on the bridge's pathways.

The new safety railing has greatly improved safety, yet there is still the potential for crashes if cyclists don't ride responsibly. By following the guidelines below, we can keep the Bridge a safe and enjoyable place for everyone:



- 1** Ride at a safe speed and yield to pedestrians.
- 2** Keep right, unless passing.
- 3** Call out “on your left” or ring your bell before passing a pedestrian or a cyclist.
- 4** Stop only in the viewing areas on either side of the Bridge or out of the path of other traffic – and be mindful of cyclists behind you.
- 5** Be cautious when passing construction equipment or rounding corners, especially in the wind. If there's not ample room to pass, wait until oncoming bicycle traffic has passed before proceeding (giving those behind you adequate warning first).

Remember – the Golden Gate Bridge is for everyone – let's make sure the pathways remain friendly places to ride and walk!
